River Valley Region: Georgia DOT awards construction contract for Clay and Randolph Counties resurfacing, shoulder rehab project



ATLANTA, Georgia — The Georgia Department of Transportation (Georgia DOT) has awarded 23 new contracts for construction projects across the state as part of their December 2024 bidding process. One was for a TIA-funded project in the River Valley region. It is:



Clay and Randolph Counties: this project will resurface and provide shoulder rehabilitation to 18.95 miles of Cotton Hill Road, beginning at SR 266 in Clay County and extending to east of SR 266 in Randolph County. The contract was awarded to Oxford Construction Company of Albany for \$3.92 million. The project is expected to be completed at the end of Fall 2025.
