The Georgia Department of Transportation (Georgia DOT) presents the attached annual update through calendar year 2024 for the Transportation Investment Act of 2010 for the River Valley Special District. This particular report will contain information pertaining to projects in the TIA 2: 2023 – 2032 investment list only. The Transportation Investment Act of 2010 legislation requires the submittal of an annual report by the CRP to the legislators by December 15<sup>th</sup> each year.

There was one completed TIA 2 project in the River Valley Region during calendar year 2024. As of this letter, three projects are under construction, 31 are in preconstruction and one is in an operations phase.

TIA's administrative and engineering professionals and our local government partners have spent much of 2024 continuing to move TIA 2's Band 1 and 2 projects through preconstruction. Regarding the region's revenues, I am happy to let you know that the River Valley region's TIA 2 collections were robust and to date we are at 17% over the original estimate projections. While this is positive news, the TIA staff will continue working in the spirit of 'cautious optimism,' maintaining fiscal planning and project management strategies that will ensure sustained success throughout the entire term.

#### **Call to Order and Welcome**

Todd Schuster, Chairman, welcomed everyone to the meeting. He noted that the TIA-2 meeting remains separate from the TIA-1 meeting and that both programs would continue to be reported separately to the state.

#### **Approval of Minutes**

Joseph Brannan presented the December 5, 2023 TIA-2 minutes.

Kathy Carlisle made a motion to approve the minutes as presented. Todd Schuster seconded the motion. The motion passed.

#### **Revenue Collections and Cash Flow Projections**

Kenneth Franks, TIA Administrator, gave the update to the Citizen's Review Panel on the TIA-2 collections and timeline through February 2024. Collections were 17.8% above estimates. A total of \$80,242,080 had been collected.

River Valley has 45 projects in TIA-2. 30 projects are in planning and design. Two are in construction. Total expenditure for the projects to date is \$143,612, although more has been invoiced.

#### **Update on Current Projects**

William Eastin, TIA Regional Coordinator, gave an update on resurfacing job lets and pre-construction updates for projects in TIA-2. Chalybeate Springs Road in Talbot County was a resurfacing job advertised in March 2024 that received a bid of \$2.75M. Lower Lumpkin Road in Quitman County will advertise for bidding in June 2024. Clay and Randolph Counties' bid advertisements will resurface for Cotton Hill Road in December 2024. Dooly and Crisp Counties' bid advertisements for Coney Road will be in December 2026.

There are several updates on the procurements for engineering work. The first task order is being finalized for the Harris County GA 315 project at GA 219. A contractor has been identified for improvements at Buena Vista Road. Concept reports have been developed for improvements at Andrews Road and Brennan Road, and a stakeholder meeting will be held in May. Traffic counts are being collected for interchange reconstruction at Manchester Expressway at County Line Road.

The first design task orders are being worked on for GA Hwy 26 passing lanes in Marion and Chattahoochee Counties and US Hwy 82 passing lanes in Randolph and Quitman Counties.

Traffic counts are being collected for the on-call design procurements in Muscogee County, which are the US 80 ramp improvements and the road diet for University Avenue. A traffic study will also be conducted for the road diet.

One concept report is approved, and another one will be submitted for the Webster and Schley Counties' bridge replacements. A concept report should be available in June for downtown Buena Vista improvements in Marion County, and a stakeholder meeting will be held later this summer. Traffic is scheduled to be collected by this summer for the Second Avenue improvements in Muscogee County. A traffic study has been recommended for the intersection improvements at Manchester Expressway at Central Church Road in Harris County.

A Need, Effectiveness, and Logical Termini (NELT) Form continues to be developed for the phase of the US 280 widening from Felder Street to District Line Road in Sumter County. Both the phase from District Line to SR 195 in Band 3 and the stretch from SR 195 to Lake Blackshear are in the same status, undergoing environmental screening and working on concept reports.

Will Johnson from the City of Columbus gave updates on design work for local let projects. The concept report for Steam Mill Road of Muscogee County is being revised. The right-of-way acquisition is planned for December 2025. Other projects with executed agreements involve Whitesville Road, Columbus River Walk, South Lumpkin Road Streetscape, Linwood Blvd improvements, Liberty Theater enhancements, and the 5<sup>th</sup> Avenue Trail Connector. Bid advertisement dates for these projects will be in the next few years.

Construction is near completion for the Buck Creek Bypass of Macon County. Paving and resurfacing is being done for Ed Davis Rd/Rustin Lake Rd in Taylor County. A bid opening will be held on April 26<sup>th</sup> for the resurfacing on Hospital Rd in Stewart County.

**Call to Order and Welcome** 

Todd Schuster, Chairman, welcomed everyone to the meeting. He noted that the TIA-2 meeting remains separate from the TIA-1 meeting and that both programs would continue to be reported separately to the state.

#### **Approval of Minutes**

Joseph Brannan presented the April 23, 2024 TIA-2 minutes.

Kathy Carlisle made a motion to approve the minutes as presented. Steve Rentfrow seconded the motion. The motion passed.

#### **Revenue Collections and Cash Flow Projections**

Kenneth Franks, TIA Administrator, gave the update to the Citizen's Review Panel on the TIA-2 collections and timeline through May 2024. Collections were 17.6% above estimates. A total of \$103,798,467 had been collected.

River Valley has 45 projects in TIA-2. 30 projects are in planning and design. Three are in construction. Total expenditure for the projects as of May 2024 is \$380,664, although more has been invoiced.

#### **Update on Current Projects**

William Eastin, TIA Regional Coordinator, gave an update on resurfacing job lets and preconstruction updates for projects in TIA-2. The Chalybeate Springs Road in Talbot County resurfacing project received a bid of \$2.75M and will begin in Fall. Lower Lumpkin Road in Quitman County advertised for bidding in June 2024 and negotiated with Oxford to bring the bid down to budget. Clay and Randolph Counties' bid advertisements will resurface for Cotton Hill Road in December 2024. Dooly and Crisp Counties' bid advertisements for Coney Road will be in December 2026.

There are several updates on the procurements for engineering work. Traffic counts will be collected in late August for the Harris County GA 315 project at GA 219. A contractor has been identified for improvements at Buena Vista Road. Concept reports have been developed for Andrew Road and Brennan Road improvements. Traffic counts will be collected for interchange reconstruction at Manchester Expressway at County Line Road in late August.

Concept reports are being developed for GA Hwy 26 passing lanes in Marion and Chattahoochee Counties and US Hwy 82 passing lanes in Randolph and Quitman Counties. Traffic counts have been collected for GA Hwy 26 passing lanes in Marion and Chattahoochee Counties.

Traffic counts are being collected for the on-call design procurements in Muscogee County, which are the US 80 ramp improvements and the road diet for University Avenue.

On-call design for the roadway is underway for the Webster and Schley Counties' bridge replacements, and a BFI (Bridge Foundation Investigation) is being conducted. A stakeholder meeting will be held on August 15th with Buena Vista city officials and local businesses for downtown Buena Vista improvements in Marion County. Traffic counts are scheduled to be collected by the end of August for the Second Avenue improvements in Muscogee County. TIA is coordinating with the GDOT maintenance project to repave SR 85. An RCUT (Restricting Crossing U-turn) is preferred for the intersection improvements at Manchester Expressway at Central Church Road in Harris County.

A Need, Effectiveness, and Logical Termini (NELT) Form continues to be developed for the phase of the US 280 widening from Felder Street to District Line Road in Sumter County, and a concept report has been approved. Both the phase from District Line to SR 195 in Band 3 and the stretch from SR 195 to Lake Blackshear are in the same status, undergoing environmental review and working on concept reports.

Will Johnson from the City of Columbus give updates on design work for local let projects. The concept report for Steam Mill Road of Muscogee County is being revised, while plans to pursue a roundabout near the school are being discussed. Other projects with executed agreements involve Whitesville Road, Columbus River Walk, South Lumpkin Road Streetscape, Linwood Blvd improvements, Liberty Theater enhancements, and the 5th Avenue Trail Connector.

Construction is nearly finished for the Buck Creek Bypass of Macon County. Resurfacing for Ed Davis is complete, and Rustin Lake paving is being designed. A low bid was made for \$1,558,451 for the resurfacing of Hospital Rd in Stewart County.

Todd Schuster, Chairman, welcomed everyone to the meeting. He noted that the TIA-2 meeting remains separate from the TIA-1 meeting and that both programs would continue to be reported separately to the state.

#### **Approval of Minutes**

Joseph Brannan presented the August 13, 2024, TIA-2 minutes. Steve Rentfrow made a motion to approve the minutes as presented. Kathy Carlisle seconded the motion. The motion was passed.

#### **Revenue Collections Overview**

Kenneth Franks, TIA Administrator, gave the update to the Citizen's Review Panel on the TIA-2 collections and timeline through September 2024. Collections were 17.0% above estimates. A total of \$120,911,850 had been collected.

River Valley has 45 projects in TIA-2. 30 projects are in planning and design. Three are in construction. Total expenditure for the projects as of August 2024 is \$12,870,322.

#### **Update of Current Projects**

William Eastin, TIA Regional Coordinator, gave an update on resurfacing job lets and preconstruction updates for projects in TIA-2. The Chalybeate Springs Road in Talbot County resurfacing project is under construction and 90% completed. Grass and shoulder work are still underway. Lower Lumpkin Road in Quitman County advertised for bidding in June 2024 and the Oxford preconstruction meeting was held in September. Clay and Randolph Counties will advertise for bids at the end of the month. Dooly and Crisp

Counties' Cooney Road resurfacing projects have four sections from Cotton Street in Vienna to SR 300 in Crisp County. Two sections are in Band 1, while the remaining two are in Band 2.

There are many projects in preconstruction. Traffic Counts were collected for Harris County's SR 315 project. Concept alternative reports were developed for intersection improvements for SR 315 at the SR 219 Intersection. Preconcept work was developed for the Buena Vista Road Improvements in Muscogee County. A concept report and environmental screening was completed for the Manchester Expressway/US 27 Alternative at the County Line Road Interchange. Both Andrews Road and Brennan Road have approved concept reports. Concept reports, traffic counts, and environmental screening are being done for the GA Highway 26 passing lanes in Marion and Chattahoochee counties and for the US Highway 82 passing lanes in Randolph and Quitman Counties.

Concept reports are being implemented for the on-call procurements in Muscogee County, which include US 80 ramp improvements and University Ave Road Diet/Streetscape. University Ave Road Diet/Streetscape is in the final design stage, developing a concept report. The recommendation is to convert the current five lanes into 2 lanes, with a center turning lane and bike lanes on each side.

An on-call design for the roadway is underway for the Webster and Schley Counties' bridge replacements and preliminary plans are being developed. The concept report for the Marion County Buena Vista Downtown Improvements was approved in August and preliminary planning is underway. Traffic reporting and concept alternatives are being developed for the Second Avenue Improvements in Muscogee County. TIA is coordinating with the GDOT maintenance project to repave SR 85. An RCUT (Restricting Crossing U-turn) is preferred for the intersection improvements at Manchester Expressway at Central Church Road in Harris County. The plan review for this project was held last month.

Need, Effectiveness, and Logical Termini (NELT) environmental documentation is developed for the phase of the US 280 widening from Felder Street to District Line Road in Sumter County. The NELT is being revised for submission to FHWA. Both the phase from District Line to SR 195 in Band 3 and the stretch from SR 195 to Lake Blackshear are in the same status, undergoing environmental review and working on concept reports.

Vance Beck from the City of Columbus gave updates on design work for local let projects.

Projects with executed agreements involve Whitesville Road widening, Columbus River Walk repaving and maintenance, South Lumpkin Road streetscape, 13th Ave/17th St/Blvd improvements, Liberty Theater enhancements, and the 5th Avenue Trail connector. Morris Rd and Forrest Rd Band 2 projects are contracting for design work. The concept report for Steam Mill Road in Muscogee County is being revised, while ROW plans were submitted to TIA.

Finally, construction is completed for the Buck Creek Bypass of Macon County, while the Montezuma airport project is working on a bid package. Resurfacing for Ed Davis is complete, Rustin Lake paving is being designed, and the bid package is being finalized. The Hospital Rd resurfacing project in Stewart County is 70% complete.

#### **End of Year Reporting**

Kenneth Franks presented the Annual Project Status Report for TIA 2 in 2024. Kathy Carlisle made a motion to approve the Report. Joseph Brannan seconded the motion. The motion passed.
